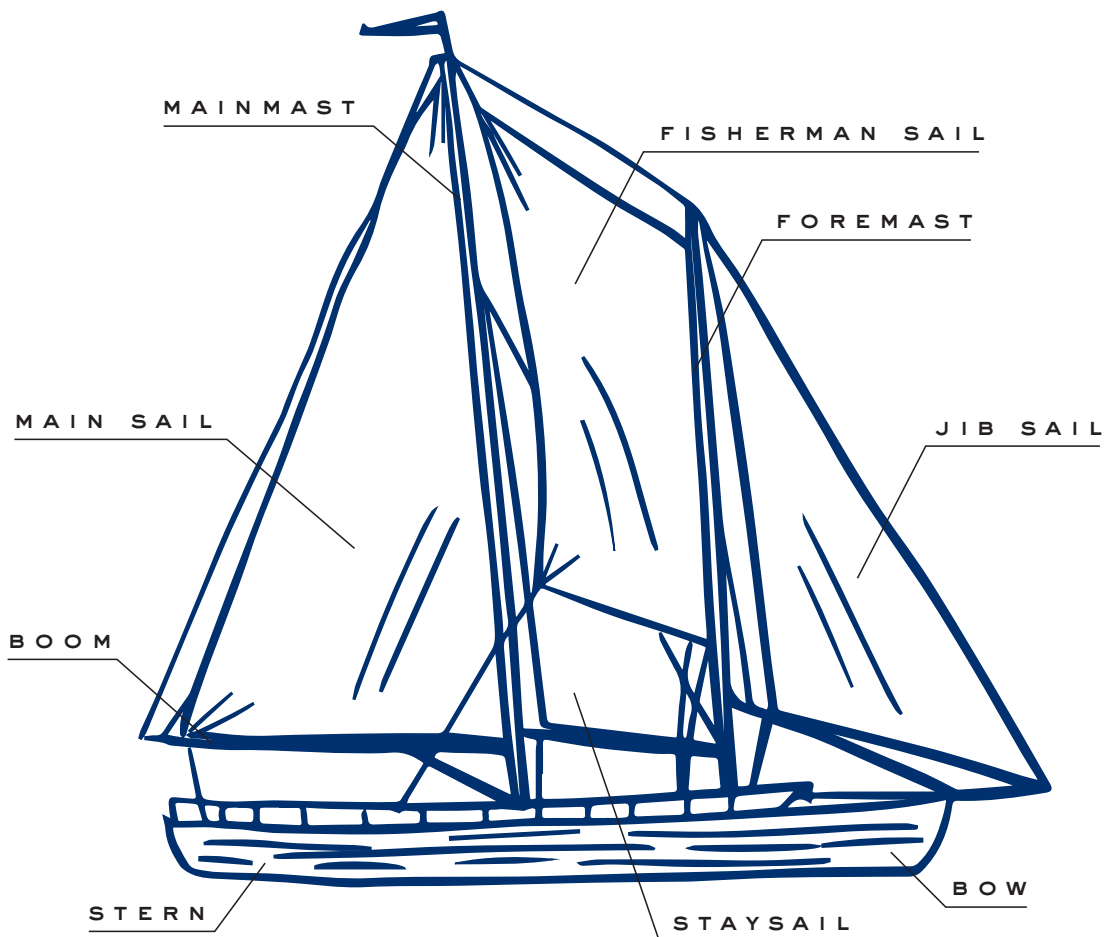
CRAB CAKE 28

PARTS OF A BOAT



EVERYDAY NAUTICAL PHRASES & ORIGINS

LOOSE CANNON
An unpredictable person. Phrase inspired by the mayhem caused when a cannon broke loose during a storm or in battle.

THREE SHEETS TO THE WIND
Someone who is very drunk. "Sheet" refers to a rope that holds a sail in place. Three loose sheets suggests the ship is uncontrollable.

DOWN IN THE DOLDRUMS
Depressed or in low

spirits. Used by sailors to describe when no wind is present, causing them to be stuck at sea.

BATTEN DOWN THE HATCHES
Preparing for trouble. Sailors would secure a ship's hatchway with wooden battens ahead of bad weather.

TURNED THE CORNER
Reaching a critical point to somewhere better. Believed to originate from sailors passing the Cape of Good Hope at the southern tip

of Africa and/or Cape Horn at the southern tip of South America.

BOTTOMS UP
Used to encourage someone to drink something. The term originated with English sailors being tricked into joining the Navy. An unsuspecting man would be given a beer with a coin at the bottom. When he grabbed the coin from his glass, he was deemed to have accepted payment from the Royal Navy and was swiftly enrolled into service.
